We have accomplished many good things for the needy and the orphans because of your prayers, generosity and support. Thank you very much.

May God continue to bless you and your loved ones.

God keeps always his promise to be our God: "So you will be my people, and I will be your God." (Jeremiah 30:22) He assures us also that He will never forget us: "Can a mother forget the baby at her breast and have no compassion on the child she has borne? Though she may forget, I will not forget you!" (Isaiah 49,15) And also we are confident that He loves each one of us and knows each one of us: "See, I have written your name on the palms of my hands." (Isaiah 49:16) Even though we know that God is omnipresent, He is the Alpha and Omega, even when we rely on Him from the bottom of our hearts because He is our Shelter and guardian, when we face difficulties and struggles in our daily life, we have the tendency to call out and say where are you God? Why me, my loved ones, my friends!

We are all in the same boat, reflecting this way is not denying God or doubt his power, Just: "C'est un cri de Coeur", it is a profound cry from our hearts, a reminder of the presence of God, in other words, it is an expression of our faith, a feeling of abandonment saying: "I am yours" why do you let this happen to me?" On the cross Jesus did the same: "About three in the afternoon Jesus cried out in a loud voice, "Eli, Eli, lama sabachthani?" (which means "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?" (Mat 27, 46). If it is your case and if you feel this same way, I would like to encourage you to firmly continue trusting God the Almighty who always keeps his promise to be with us until the end of the earth. I would like to share with you these words of St Exupery that I nourish in my heart since I was a little boy yearning for God and searching for a way to serve Him as a priest: "God does not promise us an easy cross road but, assures us a safe arrival" (St. Exupery).

Today we are all struggling somewhere or somehow; the same for me in my twelve years with your precious support and prayers helping the needy, the orphans and the unfortunate children and young adults in our school in Haiti. This academic year 2014-2015, because of a lack of fund, when I visited the school last October I had to terminate three teachers and cancel our adult activities and classes at our Family Center even when several people came to inquire about trade classes. That was really heartbreaking! There is no additional progress in our construction project to better house our students. From the beginning, like every one of you, I have financed and supported the school with my personal money and put in all my energy and time, paid my trips to Haiti twice a year for administrative purposes. For the 2012-2013 school year, I donated \$10.000 to expand the school to celebrate its 10th anniversary. This year, I give \$5,000 to cover teacher salaries. We still have some difficulties to accommodate our students in a finished classroom. At least, I am very grateful to God and to YOU that they have a place to go to school.

Please speak to your family and friends, your parishioners about the school and let us built together the kingdom of God here on earth for these unfortunate children of Haiti.


CONGRATULATIONS TO OUR STUDENTS

La Bible nous enseigne avec assurance qu'une chose est certaine: Dieu garde toujours ces promesses. Sans ambages par le biais de son serviteur Jérémie le Seigneur a fait cette déclaration: Vous serez mon peuple. Et je serai votre Dieu. Jérémie 30:22. Dieu ne saurait oublié son peuple. Au moment des tribulations Jérémie disait : « Le Seigneur m'a abandonnée, mon Seigneur m'a oubliée. » Le prophète Isaïe avec beaucoup de tendresse répond : « Une femme peut-elle oublier son nourrisson, ne plus avoir de tendresse pour le fils de ses entrailles ? Même si elle l'oubliait, moi, je ne t'oublierai pas. » Et au verset 16 il ajouta : Car je t'ai gravée sur les paumes de mes mains, Isaïe 49:14-16. Chacun de nous aux moments difficiles a cette tendance à lancer un cri de désarroi vers le ciel et parfois même accusant Dieu comme l'auteur de nos malheurs et de nos souffrances.

Tout de go, ce cri du cœur pourrait être considéré comme un cri de foi et aussi de déception nous poussant, come Jésus, à demander au Très Haut pourquoi m'avez-vous abandonné? Vers la neuvième heure, Jésus ne scéria-t-il pas d'une forte voix: «Eli, Eli, lama sabachthani? c'est-à-dire: Mon Dieu, mon Dieu, pourquoi m'as-tu abandonné? Mt. 27,46.»

Face aux intempéries et aux difficultés rencontrées dans nos vies de chaque jours, nous crions toujours positivement ou négativement vers le ciel d'où nous vient le secours: *Mon secours vient du Seigneur qui a fait le ciel et la terre.* Quant vous vivez ces moments difficiles, je vous prie de bien vouloir vous référer à ces paroles précieuses et très encourageantes de Antoine de St. Exupery qui m'ont toujours aidées dans mes propres moments difficiles: «Dieu ne nous promet pas une traversée facile, mais nous assure une arrivée à bon port.»

Les jours sont difficiles pour chacun et chacune d'entre nous. Malgré tout, on peut toujours continuer à nous supporter et à jeter un regard de bonté et de bienveillance, d'amour et de compassion sur les marginalisés et les laissées pour compte de notre société et sur les enfants de l'école Anne Clémende Julien.

Grand merci. cette année 23 de nos 32 élèves ont réussi aux examens de Certificat d'étude primaire, et 37 de nos 40 élèves ont terminé avec succès leurs études fondamentales de 3ème cycle. Nous tenons à vous remercier pour nous avoir aidé à offrir un éducation de qualité à nos orphelins et les enfants défavorisée d'Haiti. Que le Seigneur vous rende le centuple. Mèsi ampil!
